Summer Camp

In all the uncertainty, we are excited to

still be able to offer our Hoover Ridge Summer Camp for the remainder of summer. In addition to CDC Camp guidelines, modifications to camp, including individual art supply boxes and individual Lego® kits, helped to adhere to the new COVID-19 restrictions. Games and activities have been modified to encourage social distancing, and participants take hand-washing and sanitizing breaks between activities.

Summer camp has provided children the opportunity to engage with peers, get exercise, play outdoors, build and create, fish, take nature walks, play water games, and more.
