Master Builders

We will be showcasing a new activity, Master Builders, on February 1. Participants will be given free play opportunities with Legos, Lincoln Logs, blocks, Marble Run, and other building activities. "Master" Builders, or old-

er children who would like more of a challenge, will be given tasks on things to build. For instance, a Master Builder, either working solo or in small groups, could be given a task to build a park out of Legos. Once complete, we would take a photo to be posted on our website showcasing their project.

The program will be able to accommodate children ages 3-10. Since some of the stations will contain small pieces, all children ages 3-4 must be supervised by a parent or guardian at all times and will be limited to certain stations for building.

Because this will be the first time with the activity and we have limited space and equipment, we will require partici-

pants to pre-register and will have a maximum participation of 20 children. We will also suggest donations—either monetary or with used building sets—to grow the program. Our hope is to grow

this into a monthly activity to help build confidence and enhance problemsolving skills.
